DESE requires that we offer MoCAP options through their approved education vendors. The Missouri Course Access and Virtual School Program (MoCAP) has developed a catalog of virtual online courses for students. Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, students are able to take an entire course from any Internet-connected computer, available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. MoCAP's mission is to offer Missouri students equal access to a wide range of high quality courses, flexibility in scheduling, and interactive online learning.



Summit Technology Academy (STA)

Summit Technology Academy (STA) is a shared campus of junior and senior students who come together for a half-day program as an extension of their home high school. STA is a career-focused academy designed to prepare students for tomorrow's professional workforce.

- 5 Current students attending
 - Students from Holden are enrolled in the following programs: Digital Electronics (1), Network Engineering (1), Software Development (2), and Allied Health(1).
- Students must provide own transportation
- Students pay a portion of the tuition

Warrensburg Area Career Center (WACC)

The Warrensburg Area Career Center serves 7 different school districts for half day programs.

- 26 Current students attending
- Holden provides transportation, shared with Crest Ridge
- Programs offered: AG Education, Auto Collision (2), Auto Service (5), Business, Commuter Tech, Construction Tech (9), FACS, and Health Sciences (10).
- Update: HHS will accept imbedded credit of ELA and Math (2021-2022). Students are graded in these areas.
