SUMMER SCHOOL 2014

1. Did the courses offered provide for enrichment and remedial programs for grades Pre-K – 12?

An Early Childhood Special Education class was offered for preschool students meeting the eligibility criteria A Pre-K class was offered for students eligible for Kindergarten in the fall. Students in grades K-5 were enrolled in classes by grade level that consisted of enrichment and remedial activities. Credit recovery classes were offered for middle school and high school students. Art was offered for dual credit through UCM at the high school level.
