

Here is the latest correspondence I have had with Brightergy:

The Early Childhood system was shut down on May 22, 2014 so it could be removed and stored during construction.

Once the system was re-installed, the interconnect changes were agreed upon, and the altered/new electrical work was complete, it was turned back on October 12, 2015. It has produced since that date, but between those two dates (May 22, 2014 - October 12, 2015) the system did not record any production.

The district continued to pay the lease on that system during that time period.

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We have evaluated the production and values for each of the solar arrays within the Holden School District. With the Pre-School or Eagle's Nest having been broken down and stored for an extended period of time, the value has been greatly reduced for that array.

After careful review, Brightergy believes that while you are not recognizing the expected benefits at this time, you will reap the benefits and savings from the solar arrays during the second half of your lease. The expected and already requested rate increases from the utility company will increase the value of each kWh you produce.

We do not believe that any change is necessary at this time.

Last week, we had technicians in Holden to replace an inverter that had logged a permanent shut down.

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
