Important Information for Students and Parents

Classes begin for Holden R-III School District on Monday, August 24, 2020.

The Holden R-III School District welcomes students back to classes for the 2020-2021 school year on **Monday, August 24, 2020**. A full day of classes will be held on opening day, school buses will run full routes and a school breakfast, lunch, and afternoon snack will be served. High school and middle school students are asked to report to their first hour classes. Elementary children will be directed to their home classrooms.

We hope the information on this page will help children and their parents prepare for the upcoming school year. We take this opportunity to greet new students to the district and welcome our returning pupils back for another school year.



IMMUNIZATION LAWS Missouri State Immunization Law For Schools is MANDATORY. No student will be admitted to class until compliance with the Immunization Law has been met. Missouri Immunization Law requires that all school children must be adequately immunized in order to enroll in or attend school. To remain in school, students "in progress" (Imm.P.14) must receive immunizations as soon as they become due. COMMUNICABLE DISEASES Where there is reasonable cause to believe that a student enrolled in the District has a communicable disease, the parent, parents, guardian, or other custodian must respond to such request and furnish to appropriate school officials a report from a physician who has examined such students subsequent to the District's request. If no physician's report is provided, a decision will be made on exclusion from school and/or referral to the Johnson County Health Department. Any outbreak of communicable disease will be reported to the local health authority immediately, including even a single case of vaccine-preventable disease. Appropriate outbreak control measures will be implemented in accordance with the State laws and rules governing disease control (RSMo 167.191, 13 CSR 50-101.010 through 50-101.090 and 50-110.010).

ACUTE INFECTIOUS DISEASE (Measles, Mumps, Chickenpox, Flu, etc.) Students suffering from or liable to transmit an acute infectious disease must be excluded from school. Students who are excluded from school for an acute infectious disease may return, with physician approval, after the number of days specified in the current "Prevention and Control of Communicable Disease-A Guide for school Administrators"-MCH 16. If that period of time has not lapsed or if the student needs laboratory proof regarding noncommunicable status, a physician must submit approval in writing before readmission to school.

CHRONIC INFECTIOUS DISEASE (AIDS, Hepatitis, Herpes, etc.) Because of the risk of transmission of these diseases in the school in the least restrictive environment, decisions regarding the type of educational setting for any student with a chronic infectious disease or a student at risk of having a chronic infectious disease should be based on the behavior, neurologic development and physical condition of the student and the expected type of interaction with others in that setting. These decisions are made using the team approach. In each case, risks and benefits to both the infected child and to others in the setting should be weighed. **PROCEDURES** To reduce the possibility of transmitting any infection, the District has routine procedures for handling blood or body fluids (urine, stool, vomitus). These procedures shall be posted in all buildings. Persons involved in the care and education of students with these communicable diseases should respect the student's right to privacy, including maintaining confidential records. Only those persons who have a need to know (in order to assure proper care and to detect potential for disease transmission) should be advised. All medication MUST be transported to and from school by parents and/or an adult. NO medication (prescription or OTC) can be transported on District school buses unless explicitly authorized in accordance with Board policy JHCD. This policy has been placed in effect to provide a safer environment for students and to insure that medications are not received by the wrong individuals. No medication will be stored in health rooms longer than a five day period. Any medications not picked up will be destroyed. All students in grades K-12 must have verification and medical forms on file with the office. The student's enrollment will not be complete until the forms are on file. Students not in compliance by the end of the 5th school day will be suspended until the forms are completed and on file. All students requiring stitches, surgery, broken bones, etc. must have a current physician's release on file prior to returning to school. School-wide head checks for head lice will be conducted at the beginning of the school year and randomly as needed.

SCHOOL-ISSUED COMPUTER DEVICES The Holden R-III School District will distribute devices to students in grades K-12 to use for educational purposes during the academic year. The purpose of our 1:1 "Take Flight" program is to put current technology into the hands of all students to help enhance, personalize, and further develop our academic program. Students will be able to take their assigned devices home once they 1) have shown proficiency on the digital citizenship curriculum requirements; and 2) have enrolled their device in the district's self-insurance plan. Students are accountable for ensuring the care of the equipment entrusted to them. Proper care for each of these items is covered in the student handbook. The Holden R-III School District participates in a self-funded insurance program through One2One Risk Solutions. **Parents/guardians need to visit <https://www.one2onerisk.com/> to enroll their student's school-issued device.** All students assigned a device to take home are required to participate in the insurance program and pay the annual damage waiver fee of \$30.

STUDENT INSURANCE The school district is not responsible for accidents or injury on school property. All athletes must have insurance coverage to participate in interscholastic athletics. Parents must sign the "Agreement to Participate" form indicating family purchased insurance is in effect or a school policy can be bought. (Board Policy JHA)

COST OF SCHOOL LUNCH AND BREAKFAST Forms to apply for the confidential Free and Reduced Price Meals Program are available at each office and on the school website. The school district encourages eligible families to apply.

HOLDEN R-III LUNCH AND BREAKFAST PROGRAM Holden R-III Schools announced its revised free and reduced price policy for school children unable to pay the full price of meals served in schools under the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program. Children from families whose current income is at or below those shown are eligible for free or reduced price meals. Applications are available at the school office.

To apply, fill out a Free and Reduced Price School Meals Family Application and return it to the school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted any time during the school year. A complete application is required as a condition of eligibility. A complete application includes: (1) household income from all sources or Food Stamp/TANF case number, (2) names of all household members, and (3) the signature and last four digits of social security number or indication of no social security number of adult household member signing the application. School officials may verify current income at any time during the school year.

Foster children may be eligible regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside. If a family member becomes unemployed or if family size changes, the family should contact the school to file a new application. Such changes may make the children of the family eligible for these benefits. Households will be notified of their children's eligibility status for free or reduced price meals. If any children were not listed on the eligibility notice for families receiving SNAP, TANF or FDIPIR, the household should contact the school to have free meal benefits extended to those children. If any child(ren) was not listed on the eligibility notice, the household should contact the LEA or school to have free meal benefits extended to that child(ren).

Under the provisions of the policy, the Executive Secretary will review the applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the determining official, they may wish to discuss the decision with the hearing official on an informal basis or he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to the Superintendent.

Hearing procedures are outlined in the policy. A complete copy of the policy is on file in each school and in the central office where any interested party may review it.

REGISTER YOUR STUDENT ONLINE FOR THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR! Online Registration opened July 24. Holden R-III parents and guardians with students returning to the district will use Online Registration via Parent Portal as a convenient way to complete enrollment forms for the 2020-2021 school year. Once logged in to Parent Portal, click "Online Registration" to complete all the forms. When all forms are marked "Complete", the forms will be submitted to the school to be processed. If you have forgotten your Parent Portal password, click "Forgot Password". Families who have not completed Online Registration by Monday, August 3rd will be contacted. Families of new students should bring proof of residency (utility bill, pay check stub, or bank statement), student birth certificates, and student immunization records to enrollment.

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Day Plus is our district's fee based before and after school care service for students in grades Pre-K through 5th. Day Plus offers character building helping students to cultivate positive character traits. Life skills are so important for lifelong learning. We work individually with students through conflict resolution, and empower them while they build on their self-esteem. Day Plus has an anti-bullying atmosphere and teaches students to respect others, themselves and one another. Day Plus also offers homework help and offers a variety of activities. During the school year, Day Plus operates from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. (morning sessions) and 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. (after school sessions.) Day Plus offers after school care on half days as well. When school is not in session, Day Plus offers full day care from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on teacher in-service days, inclement weather days depending on severity of weather, and some holiday vacation days when school is closed. Day Plus also offers full day care 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. during the summer. For families on a limited budget, the district offers sliding scale fees to families which qualify for Department of Family Services financial assistance. The mission for the Holden R-III School District is for all students, upon graduation, to have marketable skills or the basis to be eligible for post-secondary educational opportunities.

HOLDEN R-III SCHOOL DISTRICT PUBLIC NOTICE

All public schools are required to provide a free and appropriate public education to all students with disabilities, including those attending private/parochial schools, beginning on the child's third birthday through age twenty-one (21), regardless of the child's disability. Disabilities include: learning disabilities, mental retardation, emotional disturbance, speech disorders (voice, fluency, or articulation), language disorders, visually impaired, hearing impaired, orthopedic/other health impaired, multi-handicapped, deaf/blind, autism, traumatic brain injury, and young children with developmental delays. The District has developed a Local Compliance Plan for implementation of Special Education and this Plan is available for public review during regular school hours on days school is in session in the Office of the Superintendent of Schools. Public schools in the State of Missouri are required to conduct an annual census of all children with disabilities or suspected disabilities from birth through age twenty-one (21) who reside in the District or whose parent/legal guardian resides in the District. This Census is compiled as of May 1 each year. This information is treated as confidential and submitted to the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. Information to be collected includes: name of each child, parent/legal guardian's name/address; birth date and age of each child, and each child's disability or suspected disability. Should the District fail to submit an annual census, the State Board of Education may withhold state aid until the census is submitted. If you have a child with a disability or know of a child with a disability who is not attending the public school, please contact the Holden R-III Assistant Superintendent, 1612 S. Main, Holden, MO, 64040 or phone (816) 850-4444, ext. 5025. All public schools are required to provide parents the right to inspect and review personally-identifiable information collected and used or maintained by the District relating to their children. Parents have the right to request amendment of these records if they feel the information is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the privacy or other rights of their children. Parents have the right to file complaints with the U.S. Department of Education or the State Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to meet the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

COMPLAINT RESOLUTION PROCEDURE FOR ESSA

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act requires certain notifications to parents and guardians when school districts receive federal funds. School districts must annually disseminate federal programs complaint resolution procedures to parents and guardians of students and appropriate private school officials or representatives. HOLDEN R-III SCHOOL PUBLIC NOTICE SURROGATE PARENT PROGRAM

Pursuant to the requirements of state law 162.997-999 RSMo, the State Board of Education is required to appoint a surrogate parent at such time as it becomes evident that a child with a disability does not have a parent or a person acting as a parent to participate in matters dealing with the provision of special education. ENSURING INSTRUCTION BY HIGHLY QUALIFIED TEACHERS

The Holden R-III School District is required to inform parents of the following information that they have the right to know, according to the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (Public Law 107-110). ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

Due to Federal Laws, Holden R-III School District has contracted services of Terracon Consultants to perform an asbestos assessment at the various district buildings. Some areas of asbestos have been identified, but have been diagnosed as "nonfriable" for the most part and are not presently considered as a hazard to the buildings' occupants. However, the law mandates that such materials must be either removed or maintained so that no future hazard exists. The School District has opted to manage the majority of asbestos-containing materials in the schools for at least the next three (3) years and have taken positive measures to ensure its present sound condition.
