

BOARD OF EDUCATION REPORT
SUMMER SCHOOL 2016

1. Did the courses offered provide for enrichment and remedial programs for grades Pre-K – 12?

An Early Childhood Special Education class was offered for preschool students meeting the eligibility criteria. A class was offered for students eligible for Kindergarten in the fall. Students in grades K-9 were enrolled in classes that consisted of enrichment and core classes. Credit recovery classes were offered for high school students in grades 10-12. Art was offered for dual credit through UCM at the high school level.

2. What courses were offered for elementary, middle school and high school students? The district contracted with Catapult Learning to provide a summer school program for our elementary and middle school students. Catapult provided curriculum and supplies for all K-9 courses. Students in K-9 participated in math, communication arts, science and social studies in the morning and then had enrichment classes in the afternoon. Remedial classes were also provided in the areas of math and communication arts. Transportation was provided for all in-district students and a pick-up location was provided for some out of district students. Summer school was held for 24 days with 7.5 hours per day which is the maximum amount of time allowed. Catapult offered attendance incentives for all K-9 students. Daily attendance drawings were held. At the conclusion of summer school, gift cards were given to students who missed 14 hours or less. The K-9 attendance rate for summer school was 84.62%.

Teachers reviewed the curriculum Catapult offered and provided feedback on each course. There were some concerns with the curriculum regarding rigor and time frame for lessons. We had some issues with supplies not being delivered on time for a few of our enrichment courses.
