NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT

Students (Grades K-12) **new** to the Holden R-III School District may enroll on **August 3 from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.** at the Holden Elementary Library. Parents/guardians need to bring the following documents: proof of residency (utility bill, bank statement - only portion that shows address, pay stub), student's birth certificate, and student's immunization record, and any applicable court documents regarding guardianship. High school students need to bring their transcript. District counselors from each building will be available to aid in the enrollment process and to answer questions regarding the upcoming school year.

District Awarded Project Lead the Way Grant

Exciting academic programs are available at Holden R-III School District. This year, the District received \$7,500 in grant funding to bolster district STEM initiatives in science, technology, engineering and mathematics. The District was awarded the grant from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education to implement Project Lead the Way programs. Project Lead the Way Gateway courses in Design and Modeling, App Creators, and Computer Science for Innovators and Makers will be taught at the middle school. In addition, a Project Lead the Way course, Introduction to Engineering Design, will be introduced at the high school.

Project Lead the Way (PLTW) prepares students to be the most innovative and productive leaders in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM). Through an engaging, hands-on curriculum, PLTW encourages the development of problem-solving skills, critical thinking, creative and innovative reasoning and a love for learning. STEM education programs give students a brighter future by providing them with a foundation and proven path to college and career success.

Staff teaching the Project Lead the Way curriculum go through an extensive training program for the PLTW courses. During the training, teachers go through

the curriculum, learn the software and create the type of projects the students will see in the classroom. They will be introduced to and use the design process to solve problems. They will learn the importance creative and innovative design has on our lives. Students will use industry standard 3D modeling software (Autodesk Inventor) in the Design and Modeling course to create a virtual image of their designs and will produce a portfolio to showcase their creative designs and solutions.

Students will be engaging in hands-on activities designed to immerse students in science, technology, engineering and mathematics by using Project-Based Learning. Students will use higher-order thinking skills and learn to work as a team. They must listen to others and make their own ideas clear when speaking, be able to read a variety of material, write or otherwise express themselves in various modes, and make effective presentations. These skills, competencies and habits of mind are often known as "21st century skills," because they are prerequisites for success in the 21st century workplace. Engaging students in project-based learning prepares them to take on real-world challenges.

Before and After School Care

Day Plus is our district's fee based before and after school care service for students in grades Pre-K through 5th. Day Plus offers character building helping students to cultivate positive character traits. Life skills are so important for lifelong learning. We work individually with students through conflict resolution, and empower them while they build on their self-esteem. Day Plus has an anti-bullying atmosphere and teaches students to respect others, themselves and one another. Day Plus also offers homework help and offers a variety of activities.

During the school year, Day Plus operates from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. (morning sessions) and 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. (after school sessions.) Day Plus offers after school care on half days as well. When school is not in session, Day Plus offers full day care from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on teacher in-service days, inclement weather days depending on severity of weather, and some holiday vacation days when school is closed. Day Plus also offers full day care 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. during the summer. A variety of fee options are open to families and drop-in service is available. For families on a limited budget, the district offers sliding scale fees to families which qualify for Department of Family Services financial assistance.
